2018 Grants Awarded at May Luncheon

This is our 7th year of awarding grants to deserving musical organizations in the State of New Mexico. To date, the Music Guild of New Mexico has awarded \$454,000.

Thank you to the Guild members, committee members and fundraising chairmen to allow us to fulfill our mission of supporting deserving non-profit music organizations in New Mexico.

The Grant Selection Committee is vital group within the Music Guild of New Mexico. The committee is comprised of nine members who make a 3 year commitment to the committee. The composition of the committee allows for a broad and thoughtful assessment of the applications. I appreciate the time they took in carefully evaluating each and every one of the 19 applications we received this year. So, thank you to the following Guild members who served on this year's committee-Patty Brewer, Ginger Grossetete, Sharen Hart, Suzanne Jacobi, Shelley Koffler, Yvette Lyle, Sam Sherman, and Pam Berg and Teena King as ex-officio members.

Each of these ladies reviewed and rated all of the required components of each application through the Guild's fine-tuned evaluation process. The committee then met several times to discuss and evaluate all of the applications and each member's scores. There are so many wonderful musical organizations in

New Mexico, so I appreciate their time immensely!

This year, we are thrilled to be able to support a multicultural variety of music ranging from opera to choral and orchestral groups. Per our Mission and Vision statements, special consideration was given to those projects that involve youth and education.

These youth and education projects include New Mexico Jazz Workshop's South Valley Band Project, the NM Philharmonic and Albuquerque Public Schools' Youth Concerts, the instrument petting zoo at the Albuquerque Folk Festival, the Boys & Girls' Clubs music program, free Nutcracker in the Land of Enchantment performances for students from various Title 1 elementary and middle schools, Opera Southwest's partnership with the Albuquerque Youth Symphony who will perform side-by-side with their professional musicians in the performance of their annual New Year's Eve concert, and the Rock and Rhythm Project which will allow them to include the APS 5th grade string program with their current middle school orchestra.

Jackie McGehee Young Artists' Concerto Competition

The Music Guild of New Mexico presents an annual concerto competition for young music students. Jackie McGehee, a music educator and performer, saw the need for a professionally-organized competition with a performance opportunity for its winner. Jackie partnered with the Symphony Guild, underwrote the program and served as chairman of the event. The competition was founded as a piano competition in 1992.

Throughout the years, the competition has grown and changed. In 2009, the string instrument category was added and the name was changed to the Jackie McGehee Young Artists' Concerto Competition. In 2011, the Symphony Guild became the Music Guild of New Mexico. The Music Guild now sponsors a New Mexico Philharmonic Concert affording the first place winner, in each category, the opportunity to perform with a professional orchestra. Cash awards have increased through the support of several anonymous donors.

Although there have been a few changes, the goals and objectives of the competition have not changed: To support, promote and encourage music appreciation and enhance educational opportunities for young artists; To provide the best possible experience for all contestants, their families and Guild

volunteers; To promote and increase public awareness of our talented young New Mexico musicians and the Music Guild of New Mexico.

As the committee begins preparing for the 27th year of the competition, we ask for your support. Join us to celebrate a day of music with some of New Mexico's most talented young musicians on Saturday, February 16, 2019, as JMYAC contestants take the stage at the beautiful Recital Hall located in Robertson and Sons Violin Shop. It was a long night but enjoyed by all. We have an incredible group of Señoritas and are looking forward to this upcoming year.




