This premier event provides an opportunity for young New Mexico pianists and string musicians ages 10-21 to perform a movement of a **concerto**. The **concerto** is a piece of music composed for an instrumental soloist and orchestra. It is written to highlight the musical skills and expressiveness of a single musician, while being accompanied by the orchestra.

Competition winners receive monetary awards. The first-place winner in each category also receives an opportunity to perform with the New Mexico Philharmonic. For more information visit, *The Value of the Concerto*, by Jackie McGehee on YouTube.

The rigorous Competition application process requires an audition CD by the young artist with a 10-minute segment of a concerto from an approved repertoire list, a biographical profile, teacher recommendation, photograph, and \$50.00 application fee. The Audition Committee reviews each application twice to determine an applicant's acceptance to the Competition.

The application is available at www.musicguildofnewmexico.org We encourage all young musicians in New Mexico to apply for participation in the JMYAC. We welcome all MGNM members, teachers, students, families, and friends to enjoy these wonderful performances and share in the festivities of the day. It is an event not to be missed and one that makes us all proud of the talent of future generations of classical musicians.


