## Excitement is Building for the Jackie McGehee Young Artists' Competition Coming February 16th

The Jackie McGehee Young Artists' Competition for Piano and Strings will host twelve young musicians from the state of



New Mexico on Saturday, February 16th, at Keller Hall on the campus of the University of New Mexico in Albuquerque. The competition will begin at 8:45 in the morning with prizes being awarded at 1:00 in the afternoon. These

students were chosen from a group of high school-aged musicians who recently submitted their performance abilities to judges to qualify for this honor. In each category, a first, second and thirdplace winner will be declared by a panel of renown adjudicators from around the United States. The two first-place winners will each receive \$1000 and perform with the New Mexico Philharmonic the weekend after the competition, Saturday (February 23) and Sunday (February 24) at St. John's United Methodist Church at 2626 Arizona St. NE in Albuquerque. Tickets will soon become available for these performances. The second and third-place winners will also receive a monetary reward of \$500 and \$400 respectively, and be giving opportunities to perform.

The Keller Hall competition on February 16th is free and open to the public. Our performers hope for a full house at each venue. So please help support their efforts by attending the competition and the performances with the New Mexico Philharmonic.
