The 2014 Jackie McGehee Young Artists' Competition for Piano and Strings Announces its Winners

On Saturday, February 15, the **Jackie McGehee Young Artists' Competition** held its twenty-first annual competition in Keller Hall on the UNM campus. Six winners were chosen, and two honorable mentions were awarded, out of a field of fifteen

contestants. First-place winners were each presented with \$2,000. Second-place winners each received \$750, and third-place winners each received \$500. A multitude of thanks goes to our team of forty volunteers. Much gratitude goes to Fredric Cohen, JMYAC chair; Karla Bressan, donor chair; Carol Alexander, judge liaison; Teresa Edens, refreshments coordinator, and Linn Furnish, volunteer coordinator. We greatly appreciated assistance from Yvette Lyle and her team of Señorita. A round of applause, please, for Jackie McGehee for conceiving of the competition idea and overseeing its growth and development over the past twenty-one years.

The two top award winners, Ryan Downs on violin, and Ken Lien on piano, performed their winning concerti on Sunday, March 16th, at 3:00 pm, with the New Mexico Philharmonic at Central United Methodist Church. They were rewarded with standing ovations from a delighted full house and made us even prouder of our wonderful competition. The concert was followed by a reception, sponsored by the New Mexico Philharmonic. They will also perform for Guild members at the May 7 luncheon and again with the NM Philharmonic on Saturday, May 24, at the Rio Grande Zoo Concert – Here's to the Heroes. 8pm, doors open at 6:30pm. Our other winners were: On Strings:

Second Place went to **Abigail Herrick** on Violin, daughter of Randy and Marna Herrick of Albuquerque. She performed the first movement "Vorspeil: Allegro Moderato," from the Concerto No. 1 for Violin and Orchestra, op. 26, by Max Bruch. Abigail is a freshman at Cottonwood Classical Preparatory School, and her Violin teacher is Kathie Jarrett.

Third Place was awarded to **Ivan Aidun** on Double Bass, son of John Aidun and Joan Harris of Albuquerque. He performed the first movement, "Allegro Alla Breve," from the Concerto in F# minor for Double Bass and Piano, op. 3, by Serge Koussevitsky. Ivan is a junior at Albuquerque High School, and his Double Bass teacher is Mark Tatum.

On Piano: Second Place was awarded to **Stephanie Yang**, daughter of Chengyan Zhou and Yiming Yang of Albuquerque. She performed the first movement "Allegro con Brio," from the Concerto No.1 in C major for Piano and Orchestra, op. 15, by Ludwig Van Beethoven. Stephanie is a junior at Albuquerque Academy, and her Piano teacher is Lawrence Blind.

Third Place was awarded to **Dennis Huang**, son of Leihua Ni and Donhong Huang of Albuquerque. He performed the first movement "Andante Sostenuto," from the Concerto No. 2 in G minor for Piano and Orchestra, op. 22, by Camille Saint-Saens. Dennis is a senior at La Cueva High School and his Piano teacher is Lawrence Blind.

Two Honorable Mentions were awarded to the following pianists: **Joseph Seth Zamora** is the son of Kevin and Nickie Zamora of Tularosa. He performed the third movement, "Allegro ma non Troppo," from the Concerto No. 3 in C major for Piano and Orchestra, op. 26, by Sergei Prokofiev. Joseph is a senior at Tularosa High School, and his Piano teacher is Esequiel Meza. And **Gavin Laur**, the son of Paul and Ruth Laur of Santa Fe. He performed the first movement, "Allegro con Brio," from the Concerto No. 3 in C minor for Piano and Orchestra, op. 37, by Ludwig Van Beethoven. Gavin is a sophomore at the New Mexico School for the Arts, and his Piano teacher is Jacquelyn Helin.

Every one of our piano contestants was subsequently invited by judge Tali Margolis of the Moores School of Music at the University of Houston to participate in this June's Piano Institute, part of the Texas Music Festival at the school.

At this point, we are thrilled to announce a total of approximately \$26,000 in donations to this year's JMYAC, including proceeds from the Doug Montgomery concert last September. The Music Guild of New Mexico is establishing a fund to ensure the future of this remarkable program.

It's always a memorable event, with such amazing student talent. It was so very heartwarming to hear from our judges that ours was the most organized and pleasurable competition they had ever participated in!

JMYAC NEWS - notes from past winners

Rachel Gallegos, **2**013 JMYAC string winner and her <u>new</u> violin have been accepted into Northwestern University, class of 2018. Her teacher is world renown Madam Vamos.

Maria Vigil, 2013 JMYAC piano winner and 2014 Señorita, has been accepted to the University of Notre Dame, class of 2018. Her majors are piano and biology. We are so proud of these two young women (who discovered they were cousins during the competition).

Ivan Aidun, 2013 and 2014 double bass strings JMYAC winner, was selected to perform with the National Youth Orchestra of the United States of America. Each summer, Carnegie Hall's Weill Music Institute brings together 120 of the brightest young players from across the country to form the orchestra. Following a two-week training residency with leading professional orchestra musicians, these remarkable teenagers embark on a tour to some of the great music capitals of the world and serve as dynamic musical ambassadors. The members of NYO-USA spend the first two weeks of each season on the campus of Purchase College, SUNY. Located in Westchester County just north of New York City, Purchase College has outstanding rehearsal, performance, and residential facilities, including a highly regarded performing arts center that will be the center of musical activities during the residency. The residency includes sectional and full orchestral rehearsals, workshops on musical and non-musical topics designed to complement the focus on tour repertoire, and social/recreational activities, capped by a performance in the concert hall. The tour begins with a performance at the Performing Arts Center in Purchase, NY, followed by the orchestra's Carnegie Hall debut in New York City. The tour continues with performances at Tanglewood; Boone, North Carolina; Millinnium Park, Chicago; Teton Village, Wyoming; then on the Rohnert Park CA and the tour culminates at Walt Disney Concert Hall in Los Angeles.

AN UPDATE from Josh Rupley (2011 JMYAC piano winner) to Mrs. McGehee,

I meant to write a lot sooner, but I kept getting distracted. How are things in Albuquerque! It was sad to have to miss the JMYAC this year, but I heard that it was great. \$2,000 first prize, right? That's really wonderful to see so many people stepping up to sponsor and support young musicians like that. I would have loved to see the performances. When I think back on it, it's amazing how far I have come since 2011, especially thanks to the support of the Guild.

My time over here in Europe has been amazing to say the least. I am so impressed with the level of playing at my school and am challenged daily to stretch my boundaries and strive for higher and higher goals. I am starting to feel like I have a chance to make a career out of playing the piano and conducting. My piano teacher studied with Alfred Brendel and Rudolf Buchbinder among others, my chamber music teacher holds a degree from the Vienna Conservatory and studied under Murray Perahia for five years, my conducting teacher was one of the foremost students of Sergiu Celibidache, and a mentor of mine studied with Olivier Messiaen's wife, Yvonne Loriod, and is one of his generation's most successful pianists in Europe. I have also taken courses with some of Europe's finest piano teachers such as Andrej Jasinski (Krystian Zimerman's teacher) and Markus Schirmer, who has a quite active concert career in the US. I am also taking advantage of the incredible selection of world-class concerts all within a day trip of Würzburg, where I live.

The nature here is not nearly as beautiful as in New Mexico, but the support for classical music is certainly exciting. It's also exciting to see audiences who listen to music beyond Schumann and Beethoven and Chopin and Mozart with great interest. I have seen concerts of new music sell out time and again, and that is also very encouraging. I am inspired and motivated to head back to Albuquerque and try to encourage the same kind of interest and love in New Mexicans.

Anyway, if you have a chance to respond, I love hearing from you. I am interested in what the Guild is doing in New Mexico and how things are going there in general! Have a great Sunday.
