Mark your 2015 calendars now for the annual Music Guild's Jackie McGehee Young Artists' Competition for Piano and Strings to be held on Saturday, February 14, at Keller Hall in the Center for Fine Arts on the UNM Campus. This competition for musically talented young men and women from New Mexico was founded in 1992 and now consists of separate piano and strings competitions. Carol Alexander is the event chair this year. The event is open to the public at no charge.

The application and repertoire for the 2015 competition have been revised and posted to the Guild website, distributed to local music stores, and will be emailed to all music teachers in New Mexico at the end of August.

## Music Guild's JMYAC Fundraiser: Knight in the Afternoon

Piano Sensation Hyperion Knight to Perform September 14th at the Hiland Theater.

"Immensely talented, friendly, warm and accessible" all describe guest artist **Hyperion Knight**, who on Sunday, September 14th will perform at a very special fundraiser at the historic Hiland Theater in support of the Music Guild of New Mexico's Jackie McGehee Young Artists' Competition for Piano and Strings. The event, which is scheduled from 3–5 p.m., will raise funds to help support the annual competition that benefits talented young artists from throughout New Mexico.

A pianist with a romantic flair, Knight is equally at home with serious classics and popular standards. Known for the diversity of his repertoire, his recordings range from Beethoven to the Beatles. In addition to regular appearances with orchestras across the U.S., he has been a featured entertainer at Manhattan's Rainbow Room and Essex House. Knight is known for interacting casually with his audience prior to and while performing—a most engaging trait.

The Gershwin enthusiast recorded two CDs devoted to unique arrangements of Gershwin's music, and frequently performs both *Rhapsody in Blue* and the *Concerto in F.* Among his recent guest appearances are performances of the Mozart *Concerto #21* with the Utah Symphony, the *Warsaw Concerto* with the Maui Pops Orchestra, and the Rachmaninoff *Concerto #2* with the Kansas City Philharmonic and the Cleveland Philharmonic.

Born in Berkeley, California, Knight was graduated from the San Francisco Conservatory of Music at age 19. By the age of 22, he received both Master's and Doctoral degrees from the Cleveland Institute of Music, and was awarded the Arthur Loesser Prize upon graduation.

This year marked the launch of his first program for Public Television. "Hyperion Plays Piano: The Great Keyboard Classics" is a 90-minute special for airing nationally.

Host for "Knight in the Afternoon" is Brent Stevens, general manager and on-air host of the 6 – 10 a.m. morning slot at Classical 95.5 KHFM. Born and raised in Albuquerque, Stevens has been in show business since he was 11 years old. Brent is a theatrical sound designer and recording engineer who has engineered commercial CDs for the former New Mexico Symphony Orchestra, the New Mexico Philharmonic, New Mexico Symphonic Chorus, Opera Southwest and The Albuquerque Youth Symphony. Classical 95.5 KHFM will be a supporter of the event.

Pianist Josh Rupley, former winner of the Young Artists' Competition, will also perform at the fundraiser. He is currently studying music in Germany and will return to the U.S. for this performance.

Since 1992, the Guild held an annual concerto competition for young musicians that has become one of the premier competitions in our state and provides monetary awards for the winners and opportunities to perform with the New Mexico Philharmonic. Many nationally known musicians traveled to Albuquerque from all over the U.S. to adjudicate this competition.

This event is named for Jackie McGehee, long-time NMSG/MGNM member and past president of the New Mexico Symphony Guild, who spearheaded the event at its beginning and continues to be involved in the MGNM's underwriting of the program. The competition is open to New Mexico high school-aged students in grades 9–12.

Currently, the first place winner in each division (piano and strings) receives a cash award of \$2,000 plus a solo performance with the New Mexico Philharmonic, a significant expense that is made possible in great part by the annual fundraiser. Second and third place winners also receive cash awards and a possible performance opportunity. In 2014, a total of \$6,500 was awarded to all recipients in the two categories.

The September 14th fundraiser, "Knight in the Afternoon," will provide resources to help this competition continue recognizing the truly incredible talents of our best and brightest young musicians as they prepare for a successful future.

Tickets for the fundraiser are \$60 per person and are available online at http://holdmyticket.com/event/176728 or by calling Hold My Ticket at 505-886-1251. A discounted rate of \$50 per person is available for groups purchasing 10 tickets. If seats are still available on the day of the performance, beginning at 2:30 p.m., \$15 tickets will be offered to students with a valid ID.

The organizers are actively seeking sponsors for the event, with available sponsorships ranging from \$5000 (one position) to \$500 (seven positions). \$80,000 Awarded this year to 16 Organizations

The Grant Selection Committee is a very important committee within the Music Guild of New Mexico as they fulfill our mission statement of supporting non-profit music organizations in New Mexico. The committee is composed of nine members, of which two are members of the Board. Members serve for two years, staggered terms, and must have no close relations with potential grantees.

The Committee meets mainly in the spring for a few busy meetings when the grant requests come in. Each committee member reviews and rates each required component on every submission. Then they meet as a group to discuss and evaluate all the submissions and their scores.

In the last three years since we became the Music Guild of New Mexico, we have granted over \$230,000. This money seriously impacts the non-profits whose requests we fulfill as they are generally functioning on very small budgets.
