Our *Peter and the Wolf* presentations to the first grade classrooms in both the

Albuquerque and Rio Rancho Public Schools continue to work their magic—introducing little ones to instruments of the orchestra using a multimedia

But we cannot do this alone, and we go into approximately three hundred classrooms each school year. Our need for new docents is great, in order to ensure that each and every classroom

scheduled is able to have its own docent presentation.

One never knows what will come up in a discussion with first graders. Sometimes it seems as if we are the ones being entertained instead of the other way around! No musical or teaching background is necessary, and all materials and training are provided. 
