On the Education Beat -- Jackie McGehee Young Artists' Competition

is beginning to move to high notes with many things happening...

On September 12th, the JMYAC held a benefit concert at Sandia Prep featuring New Mexico's "Piano Man," **Doug Montgomery** and two of our recent first place winners on piano: Maria Vigil and Gabriel Landstedt. The concert was enjoyed by all in attendance, and the reception which followed with Doug, Maria, and Gabriel as honored guests featured a most delectable selection of finger food and drinks provided by Guild members. Our hats go off to the Benefit Committee chaired by Mary Sue Warner. This event realized \$8,500 - \$9,000 for JMYAC.

Due to the efforts of Jackie and Everett McGehee, the JMYAC will be able to offer two first place cash prizes of \$2,000, in both the Piano and String categories. Our sincere thanks go out to Drs. Robert and Toni Kingsley and an anonymous donor.

The 2014 JMYAC Competition application has been available for several months, and we await the arrival of many applications by the deadline of December 15, 2013. The Competition will once again be held at Keller Hall in the Performing Arts Center on the Campus of UNM on February 15, 2014. The eligible applicant age has been lowered to thirteen for the upcoming competition. With many thanks to Carol Horner, all judges have been selected. The two first place winners will perform with the New Mexico Philharmonic at Central United Methodist Church, Sunday, March 16, 2014, at 3pm. All Guild members are cordially invited to attend both the competition and the winners' concert with the Philharmonic.

Our *Peter and the Wolf* presentations for APS first-graders have begun for the 2013-2014 school year. Along with a returning team of docents, we have also trained a group of new docents, whom we are delighted to have join the program. We are also pleased to welcome back docents who have returned after a hiatus. Many thanks to our intrepid volunteers who actively recruited for us, beginning at the *Peter and the Wolf*-themed MGNM luncheon last spring. We continue to receive positive feedback on this program, now in its fourth decade, from the schools and teachers.

We were fortunate to have many volunteers, both veteran and new, help out with the Popejoy Youth Concerts on September 17th and 19th. This annual event for APS fifth grade students had, as featured soloist, Ivan Aidun, string bass player and one of our 2013 JMYAC winners. Over the course of 2 days and 4 concerts, we ushered about 7,000 youngsters, teachers, and chaperones from their buses to Popejoy Hall under beautiful sunny New Mexico skies. In June a special committee was formed to investigate the possibility of a fundraiser to benefit the Jackie McGehee Young Artists' Competition. Doug Montgomery, a renowned pianist who performs in Santa Fe seven months of the year and in the Palm Springs area almost five months of the year, had told Jackie McGehee that he would be willing to perform a concert to benefit the Competition. The rest is history!

A committee consisting of Paula Bradley, Karla Bressan, Teresa Edens, Jackie McGehee, and Mary Sue Warner began the process to investigate possible venues and profits. We decided the McCall Family Theatre at Sandia Prep fit our needs and we felt we could make a considerable profit to make the project worthwhile. We met with Doug in Santa Fe to inform him of the specifics of the project; he was particularly interested in the educational aspects of our endeavors and agreed to perform for us at what we believe is considerably below his usual fee. We prepared a request to the Guild's Board, and in early July the Board approved the project.

Next the committee considered ways to promote the concert and began working on details for the concert and reception. We were especially pleased that Montano Acura and ExxonMobil were concert sponsors. Also, past JMYAC winners in Piano, Maria Vigil and Gabriel Landstedt, each agreed to perform a selection at the concert. We also secured the support of the Marriott Albuquerque Pyramid North (thanks to Diana Whitehouse) for lodging for Doug, and a loan from Osuna Nursery of plants to use on the concert stage. Also, Timothy McNamara, the Theatre Manager at Sandia Prep, is involved in a side business selling Elixir Boutique Chocolates, and he agreed to give the JMYAC 25% of his profit from sales at the reception following the concert.

To promote the concert, the committee had flyers printed, and we contacted several major music organizations in the area to seek their support in including information about the concert in their e-newsletters. We thank the New Mexico Symphonic Chorus and Hey, Mozart! for their known support in this regard. We pretty much "papered the community" with our flyers, and Doug handed out several to his supporters at Vanessie Piano Bar in Santa Fe. We also had advertising and/or interviews in the *Albuquerque Journal* and on KHFM, KOB-TV, KOB radio, KUNM, and Q CLAPS.

The final result was a sensational concert and reception. At the time this report was prepared, we didn't have final figures for the evening, but we can say with assurance that we raised \$8,500 - \$9,000 for the JMYAC. Many thanks to our committee and to all Guild members who supported this project. And thanks to Joyce Barkocy, Patty Brewer, Sharen Hart, Suzanne Jacobi, Denise Lemanski, and Donna Nicholas for ushering and working in the box office and to the many of you who provided food for the reception. This was a monumental effort, but our committee was pleased with the result, and we heard many positive comments.

We are also thrilled to report that during the course of concert preparations, and during the concert itself, anonymous donors came forth and agreed to contribute an additional \$1,000 to both the Piano and the Strings winners of the JMYAC. What significant recognition of this worthwhile project that is in its 21st year!

In Memoriam

Bob Taichert, prominent Albuquerque attorney, passed away on September 4, 2013. Mr. Taichert was a native of Santa Fe, New Mexico, and a graduate of New Mexico Military Institute. As an undergraduate at the University of New Mexico he was Student Body President. He received his Doctorate of Jurisprudence from Harvard Law School. Bob served as a Lieutenant (JG) in the Navy on Guam during the Korean War. He practiced law, mediation and arbitration, primarily in New Mexico, from 1956 until December 2006. He was the sole arbitrator who awarded the Basic source code to Microsoft in a private, non-administered arbitration in 1978, setting the stage for Microsoft to change the world. He represented the University of New Mexico Regents, UNM Health Sciences Center and Presbyterian Healthcare system for 20 years. Robert was an avid outdoorsman, fisherman and music lover. He served as the first president of the Santa Fe Opera and was made Honorary Trustee in 2006. He and wife, Zane were long-time supporters/fundraisers for the New Mexico Symphony Orchestra. Bob served as NMSO Board President twice and Zane served as President of the Symphony Guild. Bob is survived by his wife, Zane Taichert, to whom he had been married for 60 years. He is also survived by his children, Peter and Suzanne, and three grandchildren. Donations to The Mind Institute, the Santa Fe Opera, the NM Philharmonic and the ABQ Youth Symphony Orchestra would be greatly appreciated.
