## Give Thanks for the NMSO!

Getting back on their feet has not been easy for the NMSO this Fall. Musicians and staff are making a huge effort, working overtime, working for free, and generally doing what they can. They received a partial paycheck in the second October pay period for their efforts. Costs are down to a bare minimum. So many expenses are involved in running the NMSO that many are not aware of, and new money is just not coming in fast enough.

The NMSO office is gearing up for a promotion that will produce an immediate infusion of cash. This campaign is called "Give Thanks for the NMSO" as a nod to the season. We are asking the Symphony Guild members to be a part of this effort, too. The goal is to have 5000 Symphony supporters and their friends donate just \$100 each to this campaign by Thanksgiving for a total of \$500,000 in liquid cash. It sounds formidable, but if everyone did their part, no one person has to do a lot. Your donation is totally tax deductible. No, it is not chump change, but most of us drop that on dinner at a nice restaurant without batting an eye. We should not balk at giving the same amount to ensure that one of the treasures of New Mexico is safe from extinction.

Many other great causes in our city seem to rank way above the NMSO in amounts gifted and level of awareness of their plight. That is why we as NMSO supporters must rally and support the Symphony.

You may make your one time donation by check or credit card. Make the check payable to the NMSO and mail to P.O. box 30208, Albuquerque, NM 87190, or call 881-9590, and your call will be directed to the correct department. If you'd rather do something more long term, say monthly, the office will gladly set up an electronic giving plan; a set amount will be withdrawn from your account on a regular basis. Monthly gifts give the NMSO something they can count on. You will never miss that \$25/month!
